ECA: Ensuring a Voice for Christian Community

Rod Dreher, in his current best seller “The Benedict Option,” points out in Chapter 7 the positive benefits of Classical Christian education in response to our culture’s rapid moral demise. While some of his thoughts may not match up to our faith practices completely, I appreciate some of the “thick” concepts he addresses which include the preparation of the next generation to understand the historical Christian faith and live it out in genuine Christian community.

I recently listened to Al Mohler, President of Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, interview Dreher on his book and some alarming national trends centered around this material. If you can’t read the book, this interview is certainly worthwhile.

I was introduced to Dr. Mohler when he provided keynote addresses at the Association for Classical Christian Schools conference which many of our faculty attended a few summers ago. He constantly addresses current events from a Biblical Worldview perspective through his daily podcast entitled “The Briefing,” and I am encouraged and enjoy his daily Reformed perspectives.

Dreher, a professing Christian and obviously influenced by his changing theological views over his lifetime, is now calling for Christians to be prepared in strengthening their faith through study of God’s Word and prayer. His recurring monastic theme may leave some considering his views to be isolationist, but a thorough reading expands this notion to an emphasis on solid preparation in faith!

As I think about how we want to prepare our students, in the midst of a perverse generation, I prefer to turn to Scripture directly. If our students can be prepared to graduate with a sense of spiritual maturity similar to that which Paul calls for among the Colossians, we can be comforted that they will be in good hands:

“Devote yourselves to prayer, keeping alert in it with an attitude of thanksgiving; praying at the same time for us as well, that God will open up to us a door for the word, so that we may speak forth the mystery of Christ, for which I have also been imprisoned; that I may make it clear in the way I ought to speak. Conduct yourselves with wisdom toward outsiders, making the most of the opportunity. Let your speech always be with grace, as though seasoned with salt, so that you will know how you should respond to each person.” Colossians 4:2-6

We are living in a challenging generation where spiritual truths are being treated as trite and bothersome! May the staff, parents, and students of ECA take God’s Word seriously, while drinking it up like the life-giving stream it is, and then, speaking forth this Word with salt!
