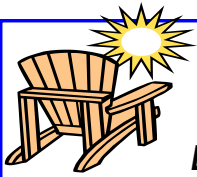

Black Forest League Varsity/JV Baseball Our Eagles finished their regular season winning the last nine games for a 15-4 record and 2nd Place in the League. At the District Tournament, they earned a bye in the 1st Round, defeated Calhan 10-3 in the semifinal game, but fell to League-Champion Peyton in the Championship game. Despite that loss, the Eagles' RPI ranking of 13th in the State advanced them to the Regional Tournament at Runyon Complex, Pueblo: the #13-seed Eagles take on #4-seed County Line **Saturday, May 20 (from May 19), at 10:00am and, if advanced, vs. TBD at 3:00pm for the Championship.** If advanced, the State Tournament Semifinal and Final will be played **Saturday, May 27, times TBD.** A special Thank You to our four Seniors: **Samuel Perkett, Cade Hammarquist, Tyler Schwinck, and Caleb Klopfenstein** who continue to be an instrumental part of the team's success this season and will be missed next year! The **JV** team missed a few games this season due to weather, but were able to find success with a 5-2 record.

Tri-Peaks Varsity Soccer From Coach Drew Morton: Devotion to performance and fighting through injury have brought our Lady Eagles a vast amount of success. They earned a very respectable 4th Place In the Tri-Peaks 3A League and 2nd Place in the 2A Region with Fountain Valley School earning the top spot. Their record earned them a 1st-Round bye (seeded 4th) in the State Tournament, and they they again faced FVS in the Quarterfinal; it was a superb effort and a narrow 1-2 defeat. Black Forest League Track & Field Our Cross Country Coaches Will Pinson and Lyndsy Johnson and Assistant Coach Jim Johnson led the first Boys' Track team in three years with eight athletes running, hurdling, jumping and throwing for the first time - and turning out to be quite the team. **Joseph Wilcox** has qualified in the 400m Run at the State 1A Meet **this Sunday, May 21 (from May 20), at 11:47am at Jeffco Stadium in Denver;** the 3,200m Relay team (**Wilcox, Nathan Cress, Trent Parr, and Buck Pinson**) won the Gold Medal at the Black Forest League Meet and missed qualifying for State by just .5 second; other near misses for State included **Wilcox** in the 100m and 200m Runs, **Pinson** in the 800m and 3,200m Runs and High Jump, and **Parr** in the 300m Hurdles.
